



STOP, LOOK, WALK!



Riding a bike near a School Crossing Patrol?



Please get off your bike and walk it across.



According to the **Highway Code (Rule 81)**, cyclists should **not ride across pedestrian crossings** or through a **School Crossing Patrol** crossing point. Cyclists should **dismount and wheel their bike across safely**.



Why is this important?



Keeps Children Safe

School crossing patrols are there to help children cross the road safely. Riding through a crossing can put pedestrians at risk.



Protects Other Pedestrians

Walking with your bike gives you better control and helps prevent accidents.



Better Control

Bikes can move quickly and unexpectedly. Dismounting reduces the risk of collisions in busy school areas.



Supports the School Crossing Patrol

Crossing patrols are trained to manage pedestrian crossings—not moving cyclists. Walking your bike helps them keep everyone safe.



Follows the Highway Code

Getting off your bike at a school crossing is the safe and responsible thing to do.
